POLS Elective (3000 or above):

Any POLS course numbered 3000 or above. The following European Union Studies Certificate Program courses also may be used: EURO 3234, 4130, 4160, 4530, 4730, or 4760.

General or Upper Level Elective:

Courses (21 hours) in any discipline selected in consultation with advisor. Students are strongly encouraged to pursue a minor or a certificate program or both; program maps incorporating certain minor and certificate options are available. At least 6 of these elective hours must be upper-level electives at the 3000 level or above. Per university policy, students may not count FYES and HEXS credit toward the degree.

Courses in a certificate program can also be applied to major and minor degree requirements.
