

FAA Medical Requirement

Airlines and Military positions require a class one medical, so therefore it is recommended that the class one medical is received as the **initial** medical certificate. Students who anticipate taking flight courses at **Middle Georgia State University must** be able to pass and maintain a class two medical certificate. Students must renew their certificates annually in order to continue flight training. Medical certificates can only be obtained from physicians certified by the FAA to perform the qualifying physical examination.

Once you request an account and complete FAA Form 8500-8 you will receive a confirmation number. You will take this confirmation number with you to the Aviation Medical Examiner.
