

TRS-80 Model 12

The TRS-80 Model 12 is a home computer produced by Tandy Corporation (Radio Shack) in the early 1980s. It was part of the TRS-80 series of personal computers and was an upgraded version of the Model III. The Model 12 featured a Zilog Z80 microprocessor running at 4 MHz, 64KB of RAM (expandable to 256 KB), and a built-in keyboard and priced at \$3450. It had a built-in 5.25-inch floppy drive for data storage and monitor. It came with the TRS-DOS operating system and a version of the Basic programming language.

The TRS-80 Model 12 was a more advanced version of the Model III and was geared towards small business and educational use. It was known for its improved performance, expandability and compatibility with a wide range of software.
