General Graduation Requirements (first bachelor's degree)

- At least 120 undergraduate semester credit hours total, not including any freshman orientation, HLTH, HEXS, and learning support coursework (courses numbered 0999 or below).
- At least 39 upper-division credit hours (including courses numbered 3000–4999 or transfer courses numbered 9300U–9499U).
- Overall GPA 2.0 or higher.
- All Area A coursework and all courses in the Major Core and Primary Focus Area must be completed with a grade C or higher (or AP/CLEP credit).
- At least 30 semester hours must be completed at MGA (eCore, eMajor, EURO, USG Goes Global, etc. courses taken while a student at MGA will count toward this requirement).
- No more than 40 semester hours of AP/CLEP/prior learning assessment credit.
- U.S. and Georgia history and constitutions requirements must be met.

Second Bachelor's Degree Requirements (for students who have earned a B.A./B.S. degree already)

- At least 150 semester hours of coursework, with at least 30 semester hours earned that were not applied to the first bachelor's degree.
- At least 30 semester hours must be completed at MGA (eCore, eMajor, EURO, USG Goes Global, etc. courses taken while a student at MGA will count toward this requirement).
- All Area F, Major Core, and Primary Focus Area requirements must be met.
- U.S. and Georgia history and constitutions requirements must be met, if not met while earning first bachelor's degree.
