

Requirements for the **Baccalaureate Minor in Environmental Policy Studies**

The minor in environmental policy studies is a broad program for students interested in pursuing a deeper understanding of environmental and sustainability policies and their impact. Students will encounter cultural, economic, political and historical contexts for the examination of environmental sustainability policies. It may be pursued by students in any baccalaureate program, and would be particularly appropriate for students majoring in biology, business, new media and communications, political science, or those interested in pursuing a career in politics or government, regardless of major.
