Matthew Swanson **President of the Student Government Association**

Matthew Swanson, born and raised in Tallahassee, Florida, is the current Student Government Association (SGA) President at Middle Georgia State University (MGA), where he is pursuing a major in Aviation Science and Management with a concentration in flight. His leadership journey is marked by his commitment to implement better systems, foster engagement, and advocate for meaningful change.

Swanson graduated from Leon High School in 2021. During his time there, he was deeply involved in leadership activities, including Scouts BSA, where he earned his Eagle Scout rank in 2020, and his high school marching band, serving as a section leader in his senior year. The Honorable Verda M. Colvin Justice, Georgia Supreme Court

Justice Verda M. Colvin was appointed to the Supreme Court on July 20, 2021, by Gov. Brian Kemp. She is the first African-American female appointed by a Republican governor to the state's high court.

Born and raised in Atlanta, Justice Colvin attended Daniel McLaughlin Therrell High School. She earned her bachelor's degree in government and religion from Sweet Briar College in Virginia and her juris doctorate from the University of Georgia School of Law.

Justice Colvin discovered her love for trial work early in her career as an Assistant Solicitor in Athens-Clarke County. From there, she went on to serve as Assistant General Counsel to Clark Atlanta University and then as Assistant District Attorney in Clayton County. Before becoming a judge, Justice Colvin was an Assistant United States Attorney in the Middle District of Georgia, where she prosecuted a wide range of offenses from drug trafficking to white collar crime. Her time as judge also includes nearly six years as a Superior Court judge in the Macon Judicial Circuit.

Justice Colvin also remains active in the community, serving on numerous charity and organization boards in addition to working and teaching at First Baptist Church, where she is a member. She is the proud mother of two children, Weston and Taylor, and the wife of Nathaniel Walker with whom she shares two other adult children, Nathan and Nathalie.



Ms. Caylee Noggle President & CEO, Georgia Hospital Association

Caylee Noggle is the President and CEO of the Georgia Hospital Association (GHA).

Prior to joining GHA, she served for nearly 20 years for the State of Georgia in various leadership capacities, most recently as the Commissioner of the Georgia Department of Community Health (DCH), the state's lead Medicaid and health planning agency. During her time at DCH, she led efforts to implement new Directed Payment Programs that secured over \$1 billion in

new funding for hospitals around the state.

Her tenure in state government spanned several state agencies, offices, and policy areas, including education, economic development, natural resources, transportation, criminal justice, and healthcare. She played a central role in the state's COVID-19 operational response, coordinating staffing augmentation for healthcare facilities statewide, facilitating the Alternate Care Facility at the Georgia World Congress Center, and leading cross-agency efforts to plan and deploy vaccination and testing sites across the state.

She is a member of the Board of Directors of the Georgia Lottery Corporation, an Honorary State Trooper, and a 2022 graduate of Leadership Georgia.

She and her family live in Atlanta and are members of Oak Grove United Methodist Church.

Ms. Jessica Walden
President & CEO, Greater Macon Chamber of Commerce

Jessica Walden is president and CEO of the Greater Macon Chamber of Commerce, where she serves as a key representative and advocate for local business. She promotes Macon, Georgia as the best community for business and directs activities, programming and advocacy that support the chamber as the voice of local business.

She began this role in fall of 2022 after serving as a business and leadership advisor for the University of Georgia. Her 24-year career in community and economic development includes the College Hill Corridor revitalization initiative that leveraged over \$200 million of investment into some of Macon's most historic neighborhoods.

Born to a family synonymous with southern music, Walden continues that legacy through the music history tour, Rock Candy Tours, that she co-founded with her husband, Jamie Weatherford, in 2011.

Walden is a certified Economic Development Planner (EDP) through the International Economic Development Council (IEDC) in Entrepreneur-led Economic Development. She is the first in Georgia to hold this certification that focuses on building communities centered on entrepreneurship and small business creation, sustainability, and growth.

Walden is a 2009 graduate of Leadership Macon and a 2013 graduate of Leadership Georgia, where she served as a trustee and program chair.



Rep. David Knight
Georgia House of Representatives, District 134

David Knight grew up in Griffin, Georgia, and graduated from Woodward Academy. He attended the University of Georgia and Augusta College where he completed his CPA internship and earned his bachelor's degree. Upon graduation, he moved to Albany and then to Atlanta for work before coming back to Griffin to practice accounting in 1999. He has since launched a consulting firm to help develop policy strategies for effective influence, communication, and implementation of public policy.

Since first being elected to the Georgia House of Representatives in 2005, David has worked on and passed comprehensive legislation in the areas of healthcare, tax, education, and conservation.

David is the Chairman of the House Higher Education Appropriations subcommittee and also serves as a committee member on the Rules, Ways and Means, Special Committee on Access to Quality Health Care, Game Fish and Parks, Higher Education, Banks and Banking, and Small Business Development committees. David is also the Chairman of the House Sportsman's Caucus.

He met and married his wife Marie in Griffin in 2005, and together they have one son, John David. David has a passion for the outdoors, and he makes sure he finds time for coaching baseball, hunting, fishing, and passing down those traditions and hobbies to his son.

ACADEMIC HONORS

By designation in the commencement program and on the diploma, Middle Georgia State University honors those graduates receiving bachelor's and associate's degrees who have excelled academically.

Cum Laude

The Latin phrases Summa Cum Laude (with highest honor), Magna Cum Laude (with great honor), and Cum Laude (with honor) are used to identify the levels of achievement. These designations apply only to students receiving the baccalaureate degree. To graduate with honors, a baccalaureate student must have completed at least 60 semester hours of course work at Middle Georgia State University and earned a cumulative institutional GPA of at least 3.5:

Summa Cum Laude
3.90 – 4.00

Magna Cum Laude
3.70 – 3.89

Cum Laude
3.50 – 3.69

President's Scholar

The Middle Georgia State University Student Honors and Awards Committee, with the approval of the President of the University, designates a student or students from the senior class to serve as President's Scholar at Spring Commencement.

This designation is the highest honor given to a graduating senior at the institution. The student chosen must have an exceptional academic record at Middle Georgia State, be involved in campus and/or community activities, and demonstrate characteristics indicating the promise of a successful future.

Academic Recognition Day Scholar

Academic Recognition Day, a program sponsored by the University System of Georgia, honors top scholars from each of the state's public colleges and universities. Nominees for Academic Recognition Day Scholar must be residents of Georgia and display outstanding scholastic achievement. Faculty members nominate students for the honor.

President's List Scholar

Students are designated a President's List Scholar if they complete the associate's degree or bachelor's degree with an overall institutional grade point average of 3.80–4.00. The President's List Scholar is graduated with honors.

Dean's List Scholar

Students are designated a Dean's List Scholar if they complete the associate's degree or bachelor's degree with an overall institutional grade point average of 3.50–3.79. The Dean's List Scholar is graduated with honors.

Honors Program Graduate

A bachelor's degree student who completes eight Honors Program courses with a grade of "B" or better and has an overall institutional grade point average of at least 3.50 is designated an Honors Program Graduate.

An associate's degree student who completes four Honors Program courses with a grade of "B" or better and has an overall institutional grade point average of at least 3.50 is designated an Honors Program Graduate.

Honors Discipline Graduate

A bachelor's degree student who completes four upper-level Honors Program courses in a specific program of study with a grade of "B" or better in each and has an overall institutional grade point average of at least 3.50 is designated an Honors Discipline Graduate.

The Mace

Originally a medieval weapon, the mace evolved into a symbol of military power and civil authority. Many colleges and universities now use it as a ceremonial emblem during formal observances as a reminder that education is a symbol of the institution's authority to confer degrees. The Middle Georgia State University mace is 48 inches in height and made of walnut with brass accents.

The Presidential Medallion

The President of the University wears the Chain of Office and Medallion as a sign of authority. The Middle Georgia State University medallion is embossed with the University seal.

The Gonfalons

Gonfalons are ceremonial banners or pennants suspended from a crossbar. They are used by many institutions of higher education to add ceremony to commencement exercises and formal academic occasions. Gonfalons date back to medieval Italy where they were used as symbols of office or state.

Academic Regalia

The academic regalia worn at American college commencement exercises can follow its roots back to the Middle Ages. The oldest universities of Northern Europe grew out of church schools. As both faculty and students were regarded as part of the clergy, they wore clerical garb similar to monastic dress.

The academic gown and hood were first adopted by Cambridge University in 1284. The custom was transplanted to this country in colonial times by King's College, now Columbia University, in New York.

In 1895, American colleges and universities standardized their academic styles with an intercollegiate code of academic costume. The style follows the Cambridge tradition with caps, gowns, and hoods denoting the institution, the field of learning in which the degree was earned, and the level of the degree — bachelor, master, or doctorate.

The gown is usually of black material: serge or worsted for bachelor's, the same or silk for master's, and silk for doctorate. Bachelor's gowns have pointed sleeves while master's gowns have long, pouch-like sleeves. Doctorate gowns are faced with panels of velvet down the front and three bars of velvet across each sleeve. Four bars across each sleeve indicate a doctorate as well as a president of an institution.

The cap — the square mortar-board in most American universities — but a round, soft, flat velvet hat in British, Canadian, and some European universities — bears a tassel, which may be black or it may be a color according to the scholarly field of the wearer. Only the doctorate cap may be of velvet.

The hood, worn around the neck so as to hang down the back, is the principal emblem of the nature and source of the degree held. The colors in the hood lining are the colors of the school conferring the degree. The color of the border indicates the scholarly field of the wearer. Hoods may be worn only after the degree has been granted.

The degree colors indicate the category of the degree rather than the specific major subject. For example, the appropriate color for a degree in Arts & Letters is white; in Business, drab; in Education, light blue; in Science, golden yellow; in Medicine, green; and so on. These colors are used for the edging of all hoods. They may also be used for the velvet facing and sleeve bars for doctorate gowns and tassels on bachelor's and master's caps.

TASSEL TRADITION

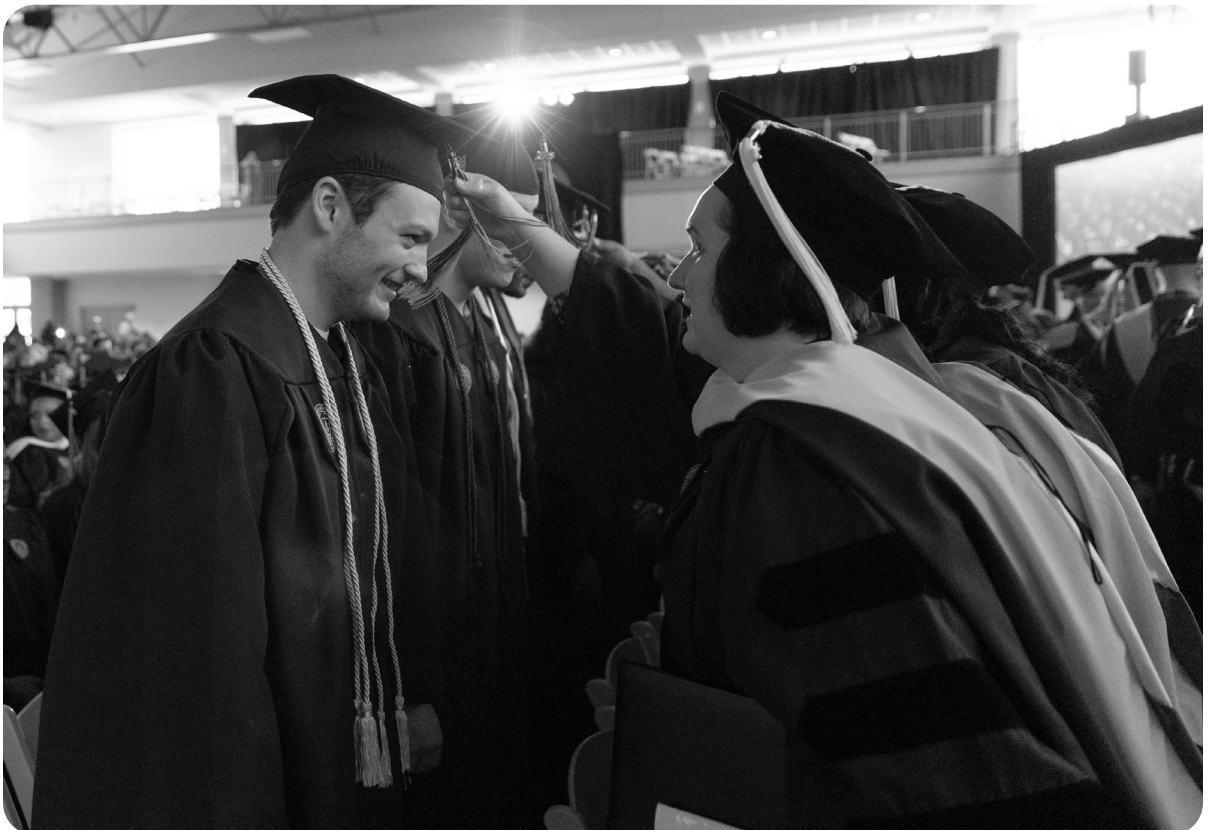
In 2014, President Christopher Blake introduced what is now a tradition at Middle Georgia State University's commencement ceremonies. After the Candidates for Degree receive their diplomas, the President confers their degrees/certificates. To signify passage from Candidate for Degree to Graduate, each graduate moves the tassel on her/his cap from the right side to the left side.

The President asks the front row of graduates to move their tassels accordingly, then he asks them to turn around and move the tassels of those in the second row, who then turn around and do the same for the third row and so on.
