

# Associate of Science in Occupational Therapy

## Suggested Schedule of Courses

### Program Information:

Occupational therapy is a rehabilitative science that focuses on promoting independence in all areas of life across the lifespan. Practitioners will assist clients in many practice settings including schools, hospitals, long-term care facilities, and community based care. Upon completion of the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program, students will be eligible to take the National Certification Exam for Occupational Therapy Assistants in order to earn a professional license to practice occupational therapy.

### Suggested Schedule of Core Courses

The Associate of Science in Occupational Therapy Assistant degree will require a minimum of 3 years of study. This is a *suggested* schedule of courses based on degree requirements, however this guide is not a substitute for academic advisement. OTA courses are taught in sequence, and students must apply to the OTA Program and be formally admitted to the program before taking any OTA courses. NOTE: Applicants to the OTA Program are required to have a “C” or better in all required courses.

### Apply to the OTA Program:

Students may apply to the OTA Program after earning a “C” or better in BIOL 1114 (Anatomy and Physiology I), and if their have achieved a GPA of 2.75. However, preference is given to students with all core requirements completed due to the time commitment required by the OTA Program.

### Upon Formal Acceptance into the Occupational Therapy Assistant A.S. Degree Program:

Students must complete a criminal background check, physical, drug screen, provide proof of immunizations including TB test, and show proof of American Heart Association BLS CPR Certification good through May of the following year. Students who are unable provide these clinical requirements or who do not meet the qualifications after completing the background check and drug screen will not be allowed to register for OTA classes.
