<b>What changes were implemented based on an analysis of the students' performance on these Student Learning Outcomes? Both old versions and new versions should be kept on file for 10 years.)</b>	Goals were met for 3 out of our 4 Student Learning Outcomes. In the last cycle, the goal for SLO 4 (Graduates will identify and summarize cultural knowledge from various texts – Test portion) was not met with only 62.5% achieving a score of 80 on the culture test. A Student Learning Initiative was put in place, whereby a formal review of the cultural concepts and texts studied during the year was done in class before the test. At the end of this cycle, we are still not meeting the goal for SLO 4 but our success rate rose from 62.5% to 75%. We will therefore continue this Learning Initiative and strengthen it so as to meet our goals next year.
