The SSC has made attempts to increase visibility throughout all campuses with targeted academic campaigns. This initiative is believed to have increased overall student engagement with the SSCS during FY21 and increased overall participation with the SSC.

Based on headcount, the SSC had 2859 sessions for FY22, which is an increase of 59% from the previous FY 21 year of 1797. This is a positive statistic as the SSC is still recovering from the increase in online student courses.

The survey is completely voluntary, but vital to the measure of the departments overall performance and success. The SSC strives to attain a 4.5 and higher.

Based on student participation, those surveyed rated the SSC at a 4.57 out of a possible score of 5.0. The prior fiscal year was very similar in outcome (4.86). There was no significant change in student outcome.

The new tutors being hired are sought to increase courses that are not previously offered by the SSC. The target is to increase course offerings each fiscal year to increase the SSC's performance outcomes.

The SSC exceeded their objective in courses offered with 167 unique courses offered, and had a significant increase in tutoring requests met, with 88.19% for FY22. This is up from the previous year of 44.7%. There was still deficiencies in areas such as Psychological Statistics and Astronomy. The SSC will seek tutors in these areas for the upcoming year.
