ACADEMIC

- Make sure your professors know you by name! Introduce yourself to each one.
- Print or save the syllabus for each of your courses. Your class syllabus is the roadmap to your course expectations and assignments.
- Review your Program of Study! (mga.edu/catalog)
- Programs of Study are subject to change
- Take a full load (15 credit hours) of courses each semester! Taking 15 hours a semester improves student success as well as shortens the time to graduation.
- In your first year, complete the core English and aligned Mathematics courses and nine credit hours in your selected major.
- Make two or three appointments with our Student Success Center to utilize free tutoring.
- Activate your MGA Handshake account at mga.joinhandshake.com. Our Center for Career & Leadership Development uses Handshake to post all job and internship opportunities. MGA students and alumni can also access a calendar of career fairs and career events on Handshake.
- Make an appointment with your academic advisor each semester. This connection is important for academic success!
- Attend the Student Leadership Conference, a free event offered each spring by the Center for Career & Leadership Development.

- Attend the Student Expo, which showcases the MGA clubs and organizations. This may be your first step toward getting involved in campus life!
- Visit the Student Life game room on your campus!
- Seek a leadership position in a Student Life club you enjoy. Strengthen your leadership skills through the Knights LEAD program.

TITLE IX

MGA EMAIL | mga.edu/email

Each MGA student is assigned an official University email account after acceptance. Students should check this account weekly! All official communications will be sent through their University email.

BANNER/SWORDS | mga.edu/SWORDS

Banner/SWORDS is the University's gateway to the Banner Student Information System. The system provides online access to registration, grades, class schedules, transcripts, financial aid status, account balances, and much more. In Banner/SWORDS, you are able to register for classes or drop/withdraw from classes that you are no longer interested in prior to the beginning of a semester.

MY DEGREE | mga.edu/MyDegree

MyDegree is a web-based student degree audit program designed to help you track your progress toward your degree, help prepare for registration, and plan for graduation. MyDegree is designed to aid the registration process but does not replace fact-to-face advising.

BRIGHTSPACE/D2L | mga.edu/d2l

Brightspace by D2L is the Learning Management System of Middle Georgia State University. A Brightspace course site allows "anytime, anywhere" access to syllabi, readings, multi-media files, assignments, online quizzes, communication, grades, etc. Every MGA course has a Brightspace course site, so be sure to check it regularly for course updates and notifications.

KNIGHT ALERT | mga.edu/KnightAlert

HOW TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the primary application used by students to apply for Financial Aid. Complete your FAFSA at

www.studentaid.gov/FAFSA

- You must have an FSA ID and password to apply for federal aid
- MGA Federal School Code: 001581
- Preferred FAFSA Deadlines:
 - Summer = March 1
 - Fall = April 15
 - Spring = October 1
- For State Aid programs, visit www.gafutures.org.
- Please make sure Middle Georgia State University is listed as a school for MGA to receive your application

HOW TO ACCEPT YOUR OFFERS IN SWORDS

To accept your Financial Aid Offer:

- 1. Log into SWORDS
- 2. Click on FINANCIAL AID
- Click on AWARD
- 4. Click on AWARD BY AID YEAR
- 5. Choose the AID YEAR (the academic year you plan to attend MGA)
- Select ACCEPT AWARD OFFER tab
 - For all AWARDS you wish to accept in the full amount, click ACCEPT
 - If you wish to decline an award, click DECLINE
 - If you wish to accept a partial amount, click ACCEPT. Then ENTER THE AMOUNT you want to accept

PAYMENT AND DISBURSEMENT

Tuition and fees payment - Once you have accepted your

Financial Aid Terms and Conditions and Offers, and you have completed the steps for loan recipients, the Financial Aid Office will authorize all eligible aid to your MGA student account. The Bursar's Office then will apply 'Authorized Aid' to your tuition and fees for the payment period.

If your enrollment status changes due to withdrawal, dismissal, graduation, or course load changes (such as adding/dropping classes, repeat classes, etc.), your awards may be changed or canceled. The payment of all charges not covered by financial aid is expected by the payment deadline each semester.

Books - Financial aid funds in excess of tuition and fees may be used for books and supplies in the Middle Georgia State University Campus Store, up to applicable limits.

Refunds - After your attendance in all classes has been confirmed, the remaining credit balance amounts will be refunded in the manner you have authorized and in accordance with the Bursar's Office schedule.

NOTE TO LOAN RECIPIENTS: Your loan proceeds will not be authorized until the lender approves the loan, and the Master Promissory Note and entrance loan counseling have been completed.

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS

To encourage the completion of your specific program of study within a reasonable timeframe and to comply with federal, state, and MGA requirements, financial aid recipients of MGA must maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) as a condition of receiving financial aid. Satisfactory Academic Progress requires financial aid recipients to adhere to the following components:

- Meet the minimum cumulative GPA (Grade Point Average)
 - Under graduate 2.0 GPA (31+ attempted hours)
 - o Graduate 3.0 GPA
- Satisfactorily complete at least 66.5 percent of the cumulative credit hours attempted
- Complete the program of study within the 150 percent of the maximum attempted hours.

Satisfactory Academic Progress is monitored at the end of every semester, beginning with your first term at MGA. Financial Aid recipients who do not meet conditions of SAP will lose their financial aid eligibility. A student's entire academic history (including transfer hours) is considered for purposes of this policy regardless of whether the student received financial aid at the time the credit hours were completed.
