<u>Highlights</u>

- Filled the Student Conduct Coordinator position, which will further support the consistent reporting and adjudication of academic and behavioral conduct infractions.
- After announcing the addition of the Student Care Case Manager, there was an increase in ACT reports for housing insecurity, financial insecurity, students experiencing difficulty managing emotions, medical calls, and welfare checks.
- Created pre-packaged food boxes and personal care kits that can be requested online through the Knights' Table website to increase accessibility of the food pantry across all campuses.

- Created a more consistent reporting structure for behavioral infractions through the continued partnership with the Residence Life Area Coordinator resulting in an increase in reports.
- The Knights' Table saw a 382% increase in usage from Fall 2022 to Spring 2023 and significantly increased donations by creating an Amazon wish list, working with the MGA Foundation to access the Food Pantry fund, and conducting 3 food drives.




STUDENT LIFE Unit Purpose
